From the Superintendent

I hope this message finds you all well and that we are able to give back some emergency days to students and staff during nice weather!

We are getting closer to having our budget for the 2024-2025 school year ready to present to the public. At the time this article is being written we still have not received a "one house" budget from the State Legislature and no agreement has been reached with the Governor. The Board of Education will make a final decision on a tax levy increase when we are given more solid numbers by New York State, but is always cognizant of the desire to keep taxes as low as possible for our residents while still sustaining our staff and programs for students.

As I shared in last month's article, Governor Hochul's Executive Budget proposal, if adopted as is, would lead to many small rural schools seeing cuts in their Foundation Aid. Her office's justification for these cuts is that "enrollments are declining, property values are rising and poverty is decreasing." We know that to not be remotely true in our communities. Property values are increasing in many districts due to second-home ownership and poverty numbers may look better because of the incomes of those second home owners, but for those that are actual residents of these districts little has changed economically.

While our enrollment has remained relatively stable over the past ten years and our projected Foundation Aid cuts aren't as steep as those projected for many districts in Otsego, Delaware, Schoharie and other local counties, if the Governor's budget were to be adopted as is Laurens would see over a \$171,000 cut in Foundation Aid. This is significant for districts like ours who are so heavily reliant on state aid. If we were to totally rely on a tax increase to recoup this loss in aid it would equate to a 5.8% tax levy increase for our residents. The Board of Education and I do NOT feel that this is a realistic or appropriate figure to propose for our community and are committed to working together to analyze the expense side of the budget to help offset whatever losses in aid are in the final state budget package. Again, we will present a tax levy increase that we feel is reasonable for our residents while providing the best education possible for our students.

I would like to wish our spring sports teams good luck as they begin practices and to our winter guard program as they conclude their show season! I look forward to seeing you at the choral cabaret at the end of the month.. Sincerely,

NOTICE OF ANNUAL MEETING, BUDGET VOTE, BOARD ELECTION, BUS/VEHICLE PURCHASE

NOTICE is hereby given that a public budget hearing of the qualified voters of the Laurens Central School District, Otsego County, Laurens, NY, will be held in the MPR at the Laurens Central School Building located at 55 Main Street, Laurens, NY 13796, in said District on May 7, 2024 at 7:00 p.m.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the annual meeting of the qualified voters of the Laurens Central School District, towns of Laurens, et al, Otsego County, NY, will be held in room 115 at the Laurens Central School located at 55 Main Street, Laurens, NY 13796, in the said District on Tuesday, May 21, 2024. Voting will take place between the hours of 12:00 and 8:00 p.m. at which time the polls will be opened to vote by ballot (either machine or paper) on the following Propositions:

- 1. To adopt the annual budget of the School District for the fiscal year 2024-2025, and to authorize the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the District.
- 2. To elect One (1) member of the Board for a five year term commencing July, 1 2024, and expiring on June 30, 2029, Incumbent, Gerard Murello.
- 3. To authorize the Laurens Central School District to undertake the acquisition of one (1) sixty-five (65) passenger bus for the purpose of transporting students to both regular and special programs.

AND FURTHER NOTICE is hereby given that a copy of the statement of the amount of money which will be required to fund the School District's budget for 2024-2025, exclusive of public monies, may be obtained by any resident of the District during business hours during the 14 days preceding the date of the annual meeting and election, and on the date of the election at each schoolhouse in the Laurens Central School District (except Saturday, Sunday, or holidays).

AND FURTHER NOTICE is hereby given that petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education shall be filed with the Clerk of said School District at her office in the Laurens Central School, not later than Monday, April 22, 2024, between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Each petition shall be directed to the Clerk of the District, and shall be signed by at least 25 voters of the District, and must state the name and residence of the candidate. The petition must also identify the specific seat for which the candidate is running, including the name of the incumbent, and the length of the term of office to be filled. Candidates may be nominated for only one vacancy.

AND FURTHER NOTICE is hereby given that the applications for absentee ballots will be obtainable between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, except holidays, from the District Clerk. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be picked up personally by the voter at the District Office. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.

A list of persons to whom absentee ballots are issued will be available for public inspection in the office of the District clerk between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. during each of the five days prior to the election, except Sundays, and said list will be posted at the polling place at the election. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making his/her challenge and reason therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

AND FURTHER NOTICE is hereby given that the applications for early mail ballots will be obtainable between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, except holidays, from the District Clerk, no earlier than 30 days before the election. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be picked up personally by the voter at the District Office. Early mail ballots must be received by the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.

A list of persons to whom early mail ballots are issued will be available for public inspection in the office of the District clerk between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. during each of the five days prior to the election, except Sundays, and said list will be posted at the polling place at the election. Any qualified voter present in the polling place may object to the voting of the ballot upon appropriate grounds for making his/her challenge and reason therefore known to the Inspector of Election before the close of the polls.

AND FURTHER NOTICE that military voters who are qualified voters of the School District may apply for a military ballot by requesting an application from the District Clerk at (607) 432-2050, or *pweir@laurenscs.org*. For a military voter to be issued a military ballot, the District Clerk must have received a valid ballot application no later than 5:00 p.m. on April 25, 2024. In a request for a military ballot application or ballot, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application or ballot by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail.

AND FURTHER NOTICE is hereby given, that any proposition that is required to be included for vote shall be submitted in writing by means of a petition signed by at least 7 qualified voters, which proposition shall be filed with the Clerk not later than April 22, 2024, unless a greater number of days is required by statute. Any proposition shall be rejected by the Board of Education if the purpose of the proposition is not within the powers of the voters or where the expenditure of monies is required for the proposition, and such proposition fails to include the necessary specific appropriation. The District reserves the right to alter the language of a proposition in order to ensure compliance and conformity with the law.

Head Lice Reminder and Tips

Please periodically check your child (especially in grades PK-6) for head lice. The truth is, head lice are always present, any time of year, just like colds and tummy viruses. The difference is, they're BUGS, so they're easier to SEE! You can try a once a week schedule, either while shampooing your child or during a movie, to take a little time to look for critters.



If you're not sure what you're looking for, this is a great resource http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=UrScqdNuTpc&fe ature=more_related. This video will help you identify lice and their nits, and instruct you on how to get rid of them and prevent further infestations.

By the time we know children have head lice, they've already been infested for at least a few weeks, and often longer. This makes it next to impossible to try to "track down" where your child "got lice". Because lice don't jump or fly, they are most commonly transferred by the direct sharing of hair care products and prolonged head to head contact. Another common culprit is sleepovers. If your child goes to a sleepover, have them bring their own pillow and sleeping bag.

What we know about head lice has changed a lot since we were in school. This resource: https://identify.us.com/ can answer ANY questions you might have about lice (as well as other household pests). Founder Richard J. Pollack, Ph.D. has earned many degrees in Entomology and holds a degree from Cornell University in Medical Parasitology (M.Sc.) He has served as a public health entomologist at the Harvard School of Public Health for 22 years. His informational websites at the Harvard School of Public Health were amongst the most viewed sites hosted there.
