We feel that this has been an excellent first few months of school! We have seen some outstanding things going on in our classrooms. As Mr. Mushtare has shared, we have begun the PAX Good Behavior program in grades PK-6. We are still focusing on improving reading instruction and the efforts of our teachers have definitely led to positive progress. We are investigating a new math series and are implementing new inquiry-based science investigations into our K-8 classrooms.

Your students will see a little bit of a change in our counseling department. Mr. Gardner is moving to a role as the full-time elementary counselor. As we search for a new secondary counselor, I am happy to report that Mrs. Heidi Sider will be returning to LCS in an interim capacity. I would like to take the opportunity to thank Mrs. Cleveland, who has been working with our juniors and seniors to navigate the college and career application process. Our seniors are starting to receive acceptance letters and we congratulate them all as they solidify their post-graduate plans.

We will be inducting three new members into our Athletic Hall of Fame at the boys' tournament on December 27. Seniors should complete all college applications by December vacation! Students who are planning to go to college should apply to at least 3-5 colleges to give them some choice when selecting a college to attend.

CLARK SCHOLARSHIPS

Clark Scholarship information and instructions will be given to seniors this month in class. This scholarship is based primarily on academics (above an 86/87 GPA). Final completed applications will be due mid-January.

PAX Good Behavior Game

Laurens Central School has adopted the PAX Good Behavior Game for its Pre-K through 6th grade classrooms. The PAX Good Behavior Game (GBG) is a preventative intervention to build self-regulation in students and has been used in classrooms throughout the United States for decades. It has been shown that the use of the PAX GBG has resulted in decreased problematic behavior in the classroom, improved academic performance, reduced risk of substance abuse, and a reduced risk of psychiatric disorders. The PAX GBG is implemented in each classroom by teachers as part of the daily routine and is instrumental in getting students attention, selecting students for tasks, transitioning from one activity to the next, and working as part of a team.

The PAX GBG consists of ten foundational areas, called Kernels that are introduced one at a time. As students master each Kernel, they are introduced to the next Kernel. Many of our students have mastered the first three Kernels and you may be hearing about some of these Kernels at home such as PAX vision, PAX Leader, and PAX Quiet. Some grades are already using the fourth Kernel, Wacky Prizes. After all ten Kernels are mastered, students play the Good Behavior Game.

Teach your children not to share any personal information or photos online at any time.



Make them aware of cyber bullying and let them know to always come to you if someone is not nice to them on social media.



Have all online activity take place in a common area of the home where others are present.




Apply parental controls where possible, but don't trust that they will catch all inappropriate content.



Follow your child on any social media platform so you can see what they are exposed to.





Check your child's browser history to see what sites they visit.





Get to know the social media platforms and what they are mainly used for.



Know what sites your kids are on and sit with them when they are online to get a feel for the content.



Regulate the amount of time kids are online outside of school requirements.



Remember it is still important to be aware of your child's online activity when they become a teenager.



Ensure they never reply to a message or email from a stranger or upload any photos of people/your home.
