Athletic Hall of Fame

The purpose of the Laurens Central School Athletic Hall of Fame is to recognize those individuals who through their accomplishments have brought pride and distinction to our school and community as an athlete, coach, administrator, or as a contributor to the development and success of the Laurens Central School Athletic Program. If you wish to nominate an individual for consideration of membership to the Hall of Fame, please contact Mr. Steve West, Athletic Director, to pick up an application form or go to our website <code>www.laurenscs.org</code>, go to athletics on the left hand side and then choose Athletic Hall of Fame By-Laws.

To be eligible for selection to the LCS Hall of Fame candidates must meet the following requirements:

- Election to the LCS Hall of Fame shall be open to persons
 who have made an outstanding contribution to the school as
 a superior competitor in athletics, and who last competed at
 LCS ten or more years prior to the date of induction.
- Male or female participants in any recognized form of sports competition are eligible for nomination.
- Athletes must be Laurens Central School graduates.
- Nominees must have demonstrated good citizenship and character in their lives both during their years in high school and after.
- It is also important that the Committee consider the athlete's
 overall contribution to his/her sport both during high school
 and beyond, and to weigh carefully both high school
 achievements and overall achievements as a measure of
 overall success in one's sport(s).
- A coach or administrator shall be considered only after leaving the LCS Athletic department program.
- An outstanding team can be voted into the Hall of Fame as a team inductee, but must also wait ten (10) years after the team competed last.
- Nominations will be accepted for any athlete, coach, administrator or contributor who through his/her commitment, sacrifices, and dedication to the LCS Athletic Program has brought pride and distinction to our school and community.

Guidelines

- Athletes must have been graduated for a period of at least ten (10) years.
- The eligibility timeline does not apply to coaches, athletic directors, administrators or contributor, however, they must have completed their tenure with the district.

Method of Election:

- Nominations shall be received from any friend of LCS Athletics or any family member of any individual meeting the qualifications listed above.
- Nominations must be made on the appropriate application form to be considered. Please contact Mr. Steve West, Athletic Director at (607) 432-2050 for application forms or go to our website.
- All forms must be completed and received by October 30 to be considered for induction this year.

COLLEGE APPLICATION WEEK

LCS will be participating in a College Application Week from October 23 through the 26. During this week, Mrs. Cleveland (our new college and career point person!) will give seniors extra attention to help them with their college application and financial aid information. Seniors should have at least a few different colleges they would like to work on applying to. Mrs. Cleveland will be in the Counseling Office a few days a week to help seniors through the whole college application process. On days she is not here, please see Mr. Gardner if you have questions, and he will help!

COLLEGE REPRESENTATIVE VISITS AND VISITS TO COLLEGES

Mr. Gardner and Mrs. Cleveland will be planning field trips to colleges and days for college representatives to come in to talk to seniors and juniors. As more gets planned, the students will be notified!

INFORMATION FOR SENIORS

Seniors should begin working on college applications as soon as possible and complete them no later than December vacation. If applying for Early Action or Early Decision, these deadlines are usually November 1 or 15.

Seniors should now ask Mr. Gardner, teachers, coaches, employers, and advisors for college letters of recommendation. Please give them as much notice as possible—a rushed letter is not the best letter!

There will be a financial aid information night for seniors and their parents this fall. Once a date is set, a message will be sent out on Parent Square

Don't forget that you may submit your 2023-24 FAFSA as of October 1st this year! It is much easier to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to accomplish this task. Visit www.studentaid. ed.gov and www.fafsa.gov for more information. You will need to register for a FAFSA ID before you can complete the FAFSA. See www.fsaid.ed.gov to obtain your ID. One parent must register for an ID as well.

PSAT/SAT/ACT EXAMS

Like last year, this year Juniors will have the opportunity to take the PSAT Exam here at Laurens on October 31. Please see Mr. Gardner ASAP to sign up if you have not already. Seniors (and Juniors) can also take the SAT and ACT exams at Oneonta High School, with registration deadlines and exam dates listed below. Students can register for the exams on the CollegeBoard website.

Mandated Health Screening News from the Nurse

IT IS THAT TIME! SCREENING WILL BE STARTING!

The State of New York mandates that health related screening be completed in our schools each year. The requirements are as follows:

FOR NEW ENTRANTS:

- Vision: Distance Acuity, Near Vision, Color Perception
- Hearing
- Health Appraisal (Physical)
- Vision Screening: Distance Acuity in Kindergarten and Grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Hearing Screening: Completed in Kindergarten and Grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7 and 11.
- Scoliosis: Completed in Grades 5 and 7 for girls and 9 for boys. PLEASE NOTE: This may require students' to remove upper body clothing to examine the spine. Students will keep their front covered and all exams are done in private. This screening is only done if the student's physician has not done it in the past year.
- Health Appraisals: Physicals are also required in Kindergarten and Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11. Student athletes must have an annual physical.

If there are any abnormal findings, or cause for concern, the school nurse will contact you. In the event that additional evaluation is needed, a referral form will be sent home for you to take to your private healthcare provider.

Children need to "learn to be healthy" and need to be "healthy to learn"!

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM HELPING HOUSEHOLDS CONNECT

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC program that helps connect families and households struggling to afford internet service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program provides:

- Up to \$30/month discount for broadband service
- Up to \$75/month discount for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet purchased through a participating provider if the household contributes more than \$10 but less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

The Affordable Connectivity Program is limited to one monthly service discount and one device discount per household.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if the household income is at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, or if a member of the household meets at least one of the criteria below:

- · Received a Federal Pell Grant during the current award year
- Participates in the Free and reduced-Price School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income internet program
- · Participates in one of these assistance programs:
 - SNAP
 - Medicaid
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance
 - · Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - · WIC
 - · Veterans Pension or Survivor Benefits
 - · or Lifeline;
- Participates in one of these assistance programs and lives on Qualifying Tribal lands:
 - · Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
 - Tribal TANF
 - · Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations
 - · Tribal Head Start (income based)

TWO STEPS TO ENROLL

- Step 1: Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application.
- Step 2: Contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Some providers may have an alternative application that they will ask you to complete. Eligible households must both apply for the program and contact a participating provider to select a service plan.
