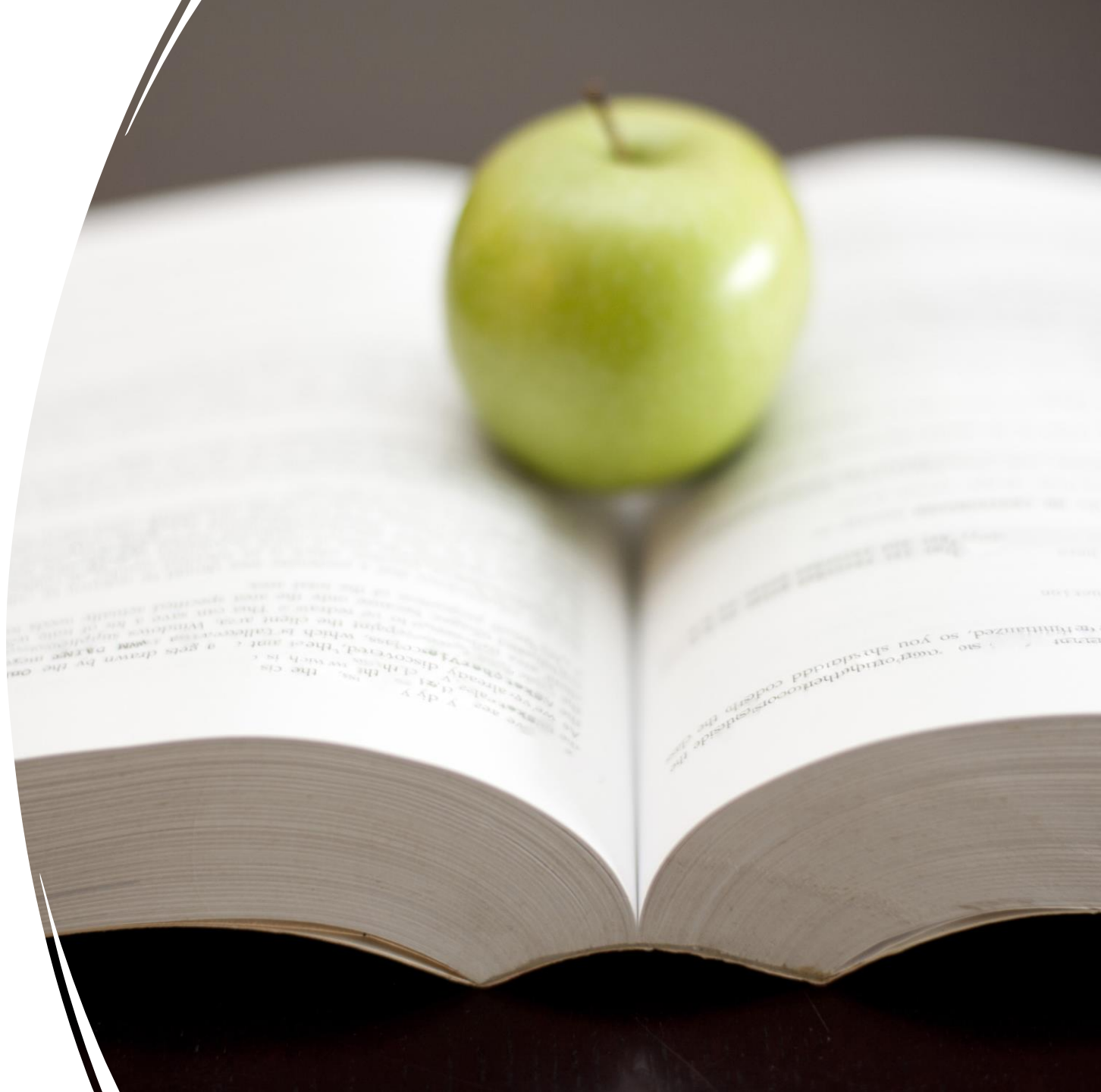
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Resource Room

- What is it? Resource Room is a place for students to work on skills to support them in the general education classes, as well as working on their yearly IEP goals.



4th Grade Resource Room

- Students come for 40 minutes a day to work on math and ELA skills to help them succeed in their general education classes. We work on the following skills through engaging activities and game-based practice:

Math:

- Place Value Understanding
- Fluency with addition and subtraction
- Reading and understanding word problems
- Fluency with multiplying and dividing numbers

Reading:

- Decoding
- Reading comprehension
- Responding to text through writing



Consultant Teacher Services

When a student has consultant teacher services, they have TWO teachers (their regular teacher and a special education teacher), in their classroom to support their learning. The general education teacher provides the instruction, while the special education teacher provides tools for the students to be successful, given the 4th grade curriculum. The special education teacher provides the following:

- visual supports (multiplication charts, place value charts, mnemonic strategies etc. tailored to each student's needs)
- reteaching or preteaching of difficult concepts (this can be done in the classroom or in the resource room)
- modifications to curriculum (through the daily lessons or homework)
- Information read or broken down into smaller chunks
- Testing accommodations

7th Grade Resource Room

- Students come for 40 minutes each day to work on the following skills to help them be successful students in junior high:
 - organization skills
 - time management
 - study skills
 - vocabulary
 - decoding multi-syllabic words
 - comprehension
 - math skills
 - writing support
 - assistive technology



Ways to Help at Home

If you want to support your child at home, you can work on the following:

- Quiz them on their multiplication facts- Students have flash cards that will be added to, as they master each fact (4th Grade)
- Have them read to you- Research shows that reading just 20 minutes a day has a profound impact on student achievement
- Look at their agenda- Students write their assignments here, so you can stay up-to-date on what they owe each day
